

In 2021, Rise relocated to their new space, a building originally built as a synagogue in the 1930's and most recently used as a Union Hall for Local 94 of IBEW. The space was once again furnished with donated items. Only this time, most of the furniture was donated by local corporate sponsor, Amicus Therapeutics. Rather than dispose of furniture that would no longer be used when relocating their offices in 2020, Amicus turned to dancker, their interior solutions provider, to store select furniture for Rise to use when their new space was ready.
























With plenty of natural light, the work space includes many plants and inspirational artwork created by the children served by Rise.












Rise has a separate, more private area to support the various groups they serve. A different entrance leads to an area with more comfortable furniture and plenty of room for children to also feel supported and safe.

Much of the artwork featured throughout the space has been created by children who attend Rise's Summer Camp. A collaboration of talent, background and frames are usually painted by younger children, while older children complete the detailed artwork.
